
Advancing opportunities for women and people with physical disabilities.

GRANTS

EDUCATION, LEADERSHIP & LIFE SKILLS

Empowering girls and women through education and leadership ignites exponential growth. ABSF's Women's Education, Leadership, and Life Skills grants champion high-quality education for adolescent girls and young women, emphasizing foundational life skills, leadership, sexual and reproductive health, and mentorship. By fostering a supportive environment, it's the partners who help unlock the full potential of future female leaders.





EMPOWERED GIRLS

Empowered Girls (EG), a Tanzanian NGO, aims to empower girls to thrive by providing mentorship programs in schools. They help girls develop self-awareness, life skills, and health education, empowering them to pursue their dreams confidently. EG also engages parents, communities, and boys to support girls' aspirations. In 2023, EG graduated 413 girls from their 4-year empowerment program and 51 teachers in their building a positive school culture program.

WOMEN'S ENTREPRENEURSHIP

Women-led businesses transform local and global communities. Women reinvest their resources in their families, communities, and countries, making the whole world a better place - for everyone. ABSF partners with organizations supporting entrepreneurship and vocational training for women.



Young Strong Mothers' Foundation





Young Strong Mothers Foundation (YSMF), founded by the dynamic mother-daughter duo Jackie and Rose, turns personal challenges into empowerment. They inspire, advocate, and support the rights of adolescent girls and young mothers, aiming to be a beacon of hope across mainland Tanzania. YSMF addresses health, social, educational, legal, and financial needs, dedicated to creating a brighter future for vulnerable girls, young mothers, and their children.

Girl Up Initiative Uganda

<u>Girl Up Initiative Uganda (GUIU)</u> is building a vibrant movement of girls and young women through leadership, sexual & reproductive health education, and skills development. ABSF has partnered with GUIU for years, supporting their Mazuri Design Hub, offering fashion and design training for out-of-school girls. This year, GUIU expanded to include digital literacy and mechanics apprenticeship, empowering young women with job readiness skills for male-dominated fields.

Mazuri Design Hub Impact in 2023:

- 100 girls were trained
- 98 girls graduated
- **30** girls linked to employment opportunities
- 25 girls apprenticed in mechanics
- 25 girls attained digital literacy skills



GRANTS

DISABILITY INCLUSION



ABSF partners with organizations focusing on locally sourced mobility devices, inclusive education, advocacy, and job training for people with disabilities. With over 100 million children in the developing world living with untreated disabilities, ABSF prioritizes organizations that promote employment, comprehensive care, education, and high quality mobility devices for people with disabilities.

Partner Highlight

Autonomía Libertad en Movimiento A.C.

<u>Autonomía Libertad en Movimiento A.C.(ALEM)</u> is an innovative organization in Mexico utilizing a transformation approach to disabilities. Mechanical technicians with disabilities work on mobility devices through their "Jazz My Wheelchair" clinics, which take place in communities throughout Mexico.

ALEM's impact in 2023:

- Employed 10 people with disabilities, 5 women/5 men
- Repaired over 3,000 wheelchairs
- Educated over 3,000 PWDs and their family members on wheelchair maintenance and repair



Community Based Inclusive Development Organization

<u>Community Based Inclusive Development Organization (CBIDO)</u>, located in Karagwe, Tanzania, is dedicated to transforming the lives of children and young people with disabilities. With a vision of creating an inclusive society where everyone can achieve their full potential and live with dignity, CBIDO specializes in a dynamic community-based rehabilitation model. Their innovative approach includes prevention, parent and caregiver education, personalized interventions, vocational training, savings groups, and incomegenerating projects, all designed to support and empower children with disabilities.







COLLABORATIONS

As a small, relationship focused foundation, ABSF is able to leverage our connections to network within our community, providing capacity building opportunities for our partners. One such example is CREATIVE ACTION INSTITUTE (CAI).

CREATIVE ACTION INSTITUTE

For several years, ABSF has collaborated with CAI to provide leadership and mentorship training to several ABSF partners. Within CAI, the Sauti ya Dada program is a collaboration with dozens of community-based organizations in East Africa that serve girls. Many are organizations with few or no staff and low or no budgets. In this way, CAI manifests its mission to catalyze community-driven solutions that advance gender equality and climate justice globally. This partnership exemplifies the power of collective action in creating sustainable and impactful change.

Grant Allocations

In 2023 ABSF distributed \$507,650 in grants across Guatemala, Kenya, Mexico, Rwanda, Tanzania, USA, and Uganda.





Investments

ABSF believes private foundations have a moral duty to align all of their resources with their mission, thereby exponentially increasing their impact. To this end, ABSF has fully committed its endowment to mission and values-aligned impact investments complementing our charitable goals.

Investee Highlight - Grupo Murlota, Mexico

Grupo Murlota challenges corporate conglomerates by sourcing surplus eggs from rural producers through a cooperative model. Rural micro-entrepreneurs, mainly women, seniors, and people with disabilities, are provided with start-up infrastructure, market linkages, business training, and technical assistance, increasing their yields and income. This backyard production model offers convenient employment at home and encourages joining community networks, enhancing business skills and social cohesion. Today, 40,000 women are raising poultry and increasing their incomes through Grupo Murlota.






